Many years ago, I got to do something that I'd always wanted to: read Paul's words on love from 1 Corinthians 13 at a wedding. It made me look again at what he wrote all those years ago. *A bit different to now*, I thought. And it made me wonder how young people today would describe love. So I asked them.

They were clear from the beginning that love does not do prejudice. Love doesn't see the colour of your skin one of them told me. They were also quite certain that it wasn't aggressive. Love doesn't say *Who do you think you're looking at?* another youngster told me. Nearly as important, was their conviction that real love knows better than to make a big fuss out of next to nothing.

I was bowled over by the variety of ideas they came up with. There were little things like hugs. But perhaps that it isn't little at all. A hug is what makes you secure again when people have knocked over big chunks of your world and you're feeling battered and bruised.

Then there was the feeling that, if you loved someone, you had to give them space. Sometimes people don't even want their best friends close and you need to respect that. There were lots of other ideas including the need to say *sorry* even if you weren't entirely to blame. As one of them put it, "It doesn't matter how it went wrong, you've got to put it right."

We continue to pray for those members of our Church Family and Friends who are unwell and all those who mourn.
