: a family advent calendar part 1

- 1 This calendar covers events from June 2020 to November 2021. It's is how it was back then for us. But perhaps some of it was not so different to 2,000years ago. A baby was going to be born but no one knew for certain quite how it would happen. Only God.
- 2 I don't get presents on Father's Day. At least, not usually. In 2020, it was different. A fuzzy back and white scan on a scrap of paper: the promise of a child, a grandson. At that moment, there was no guarantee of where he would live. It wasn't a case of Nazareth or Bethlehem but Bedminster or Warmley. We couldn't be sure. You just have to trust it will happen.
- 3 The big thing with promises is that you don't know how they will work out. A promise should secure everything. That's what the angels clearly think. But Mary seems to know better. Promises don't quite work like that. The bigger the promise, the greater the fears about it. The challenge is always the road ahead.
- 4 What if the Warmley house had fallen through? All sorts of people didn't move in 2020 in spite of their expectations. Well, it would have been a mess but we'd have sorted it out together just as they did in Bethlehem. No need to panic. Somebody will make space; someone will sort it out. That's what friends and family are for.
- 5 The move happened. Unlikely as it seemed, the deals got over the line. But it wasn't a nicely finished, everything-in-place property. Instead, it was a ramshackle wonder that would need years of hard work and care. Beautiful but challenging. In fact, a bit like the arrival of a child into this strange, complicated but still wonderful world.

We continue to pray for those members of our Church Family and Friends who are unwell and all those who mourn.
