Excessive modesty has never been a family failing but even so I was a bit taken aback. She talked a little more and I realised this was not really about over confidence so much as relief that all the work she had put in seemed to have paid off.

It cheered me up to hear her so positive about her work. I'd been reading the Book of Job in the week before and had been thinking about how so much advice and comment is negative, even when it comes from friends or close colleagues.

We've got a real tendency, when something goes wrong, to look around for someone to blame and pile in with our criticism even when the evidence is pretty thin on the ground. People need understanding; they need solutions, not a chance to feel miserable. And was she right to be so confident? As it happens, yes!

We continue to pray for those members of our Church Family and Friends who are unwell and all those who mourn.
