The second part of *Kings* is, in many ways, darker than the first. The outside threat to the kingdoms comes from the Assyrians and Babylonians. But the leaders of both Israel and Judah seem very capable of wreaking plenty of destruction themselves.

A need to learn the basics

This is history with the warts on show, where whole families get slaughtered just for being related to the wrong person.

King Amaziah is newsworthy because he doesn't wipe out hundreds in revenge for the death of his father. 'Parents should not be killed for the crimes of their children,' he declares, 'Children should not die for the crimes of their parents.'

A short guide to the book

Do you call on God or your own kind of experts? That's the question at the very start of *2 Kings*. And if you do call on God, will you do what he says? This is a world where kings could make a difference but don't and even the basic laws get lost. In contrast, when Josiah stumbles across those very rules, he follows them. Naaman finds God when he loses his ego and Joash discovers the right way when he's doing the right thing. The bright intervals are a sign that life doesn't need to end in tears. The fact that it did is a reminder that happy endings are not automatically guaranteed.
