We get old. It happens with radio just as in any other part of life. I haven't done Radio 4 in over 40 years now. My last three hour Sunday Breakfast show was in the late 80s. Then Radio 2 changed their overnight schedules a decade ago and that work disappeared as well. Where once I was doing all sorts of things I eventually found myself doing a Pause for Thought perhaps once or twice a vear for Radio Wales.

I didn't mind because I'd had my time and simply did my best on the occasional outings that I got. It was time for a younger crew. Then the phone rang. It was the new producer – he'd decided they needed fewer presenters doing thoughts in order to establish more of a rapport with presenters. It was nice of him to ring but I thought I knew what was coming. My stint was over.

I was utterly wrong. Actually he wanted me because he thought I could do what they wanted. He offered me five Monday afternoon slots in September with Behnaz Akhgar. So that's what I'll be doing at around 3.30pm each Monday. It's a reminder that you can never predict what happens, you just go out and do what you can.

Of course, as it's radio, you rarely get much sense of whether what you've done does any good so the reward is purely to deliver things as best you can. But the other evening I saw a guy called Brian who I'd met occasionally 50 years ago. 'I heard you once on Radio 4,' he told me. 'I was in bad place. I'd lost my marriage and given up on church. Hearing what you said made me want to come back and I did.' The gap between the broadcast and hearing its effect was a full 40 years. You just never know!
