## A second Letter to Timothy

: Paul's letter in a Bible in Ten version (Part two)

Dear Timothy: You know we won't break world records if we don't put in the training miles; we can't be a soldier and have a part-time job on the side; we're not only a farmer on the days that the sun shines. I'm in chains now but the message isn't. Keep in your head these truths about Christ. If we've died with him, we'll live with him; if we don't give up, we'll be by his side through all eternity. If we turn our back on him, he'll have no choice but to do the same but, if we fall behind, he will always wait for us.

Stand by this and don't get drawn into nit-picking about the detail. The church, like everything else, is a real assortment. Become one of the best bits of that mixture. To be useful to God you need to have a clean heart. So avoid all the rubbish that goes on around you. And focus all your energies on being the kind of person God can use: kind, patient, faithful and easy to get along with.

There'll be hard times ahead when you'll be surrounded by heartless ones: puffed up, greedy people with little pity or self-control. Of course, they won't look like that. In fact, they may seem very religious on the face of it. But it won't be real.

Timothy, you know me: what I teach and what my life's been like. It's been hard but the Lord's got me through the bad times. And I think that's the same for all of us.
